

Conference Venue

The GARAD conference will take place in the **King's Building** at the Strand Campus of King's College (WC2R 2LS) London.



Registration

Travel

Heathrow, Stansted and Gatwick Airports are well connected to central London by train and the underground tube system.

From Heathrow Airport: Take the underground train on the "PICCADILLY LINE" (dark blue line on the map below) and change at "SOUTH KENSINGTON" tube station onto the "DISTRICT OR CIRCLE LINE" (shown dark green and yellow, respectively on the tube map) and alight at "**TEMPLE**" underground tube station.

From Stansted Airport: Take train to "LIVERPOOL STREET" station and then take the underground train on the "DISTRICT OR CIRCLE LINE" to "**TEMPLE**" tube station.

From Gatwick Airport: Take train to "VICTORIA" train station. Change to underground tube "DISTRICT OR CIRCLE LINE" and alight at **TEMPLE** tube station.





From "TEMPLE" underground tube station follow the pedestrian track indicated on maps below:


From TEMPLE tube station to Conference Venue (Strand Campus, King's College)



From TEMPLE tube station to Strand Palace Hotel (alternatively Embankment Underground Station is also near by to Strand Palace Hotel)




